Understanding Horse Body Language

Happy/relaxed horse body language



Standing upright with a relaxed posture, resting hind leg, ears facing up and foward, relaxed face with closed mouth, natural shaped nostrils and eyes with no white showing in the eyes.

Worried/anxious horse body language



Standing upright with raised head, ears pointing backward or in different directions, tense eyes, cheeks, and muzzle, and square nostrils. Horse may be feeling anxious and in pain.

Angry/unhappy horse body language




Long, wrinkled nostrils, ears held slightly back.



Long, wrinkled, open nostrils, ears back and flat, whites of eyes showing, teeth showing, lunging posture.



Relaxed, resting postue, upright with head and neck low, resting hind leg, ears low and pointing outward, relaxed muzzle, nostrils, and eyes, dozing and easily startled.



Leaning back posture, ready to run, with a raised head, ears back, white of the eyes showing, tense eye muscles and muzzle, and square nostrils.



Long, wrinkled nostrils, ears held back, facing source of annoyance.



Ready to kick, tense, swishing tail, wrinkled, long, open nostrils, ears flat against neck, white of eyes showing, and head raised.
